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RULES FOR GOVERNMENT EARLY CHILDHOOD CENTRES

- 1. Children should be accepted at each center only after applications and clinical forms are completed and submitted.
- 2. Children are accepted in the nursery at three (3) months: for the preschool the year in which they make three (3).
- 3. All Day Care Centres (birth-5yrs) open at 7:00 a.m. and close at 5 p.m.
 - Preschools (3-5yrs) open at 8:00 a.m. and clos at 4:00 pm.
 - Children should be brought to the centre no later than 8:30 a.m. Responsible person (s) must sign the child In/Out.
- 4. Center staff should be notified when a child is going to be late.
 - Phone # -----Cell #-----
- 5. Supervisor/ Teacher/ Nursery Assistant should be notified if a child is not well.
- 6. Children who are sick would not be accommodated at the centre (e.g. diarrhea, vomiting, fever, ring worms and contagious diseases).
- 7. Medication to be administered must be prescribed by a doctor.
 - •Written and verbal notification of the hours when medication must be given to staff (Supervisor/Teacher/ Nursery Assistant).
- 8. A change of clothing is required for preschoolers.
- 9. Two change of clothing are needed for all nursery children.
 - Parents are obligated to provide pampers and wipes
- 10. The Child Month or school T-shirt is to be worn on Fridays.

- 11. Children are not allowed in the centre with:
 - jewelry (eg. chains, ear rings, bracelets, rings)
 - rubber bands, hair beads, braids or extensions
- 12. Boys will not be accepted in the preschool with long hair except for religious purposes (must be well groomed).
- 13. Parents are expected to provide fruits for their child for two days.
 - Tuesdays
 - Thursdays
- 14. All government centers are closed only in December.
- 15. Child Month is celebrated in the month of June annually. Parents are expected to participate in the activities planned. Please note that during this time centres may be closed for a half / whole day to accommodate the execution of specific activities.
- 16. Parents are expected to play an integral part in the development of their child/children at the centre. To this end:
 - Monthly Meetings/workshops are held for parents.
 - A special sub-committee comprising of teachers, nursery assistants, parents and community members is put in place (organized) for the effective and efficient execution of the programme.
 - Parents should not miss three (3) consecutive meetings. A record showing the registration of parents' attendance at each meeting is kept.
 - Parents must comply with the stipulated requirements for registration as they relate to the early childhood subvention (ECS).
 - Parents should make voluntary contributions to the center to further improve the quality of care and education offered.
- 17. Parents are expected to be respectful at all times. Disrespectful behavior will be addressed by the Ministry of Education/ Early Childhood Development Unit.
- 18. Parents are required to dress modestly when entering the Centre (eg. No extremely short pants, spaghetti straps, belly out tops, barefeet, men should always wear a shirt).
